**REPORT ON SUPPORTIVE SUPERVISION / DATA AUDITING ON MALARIA
PREVENTION AND CONTROL ACTIVITIES IN KOINADUGU, BOMBALI, TONKOLILI,
PORTLOKO AND KAMBIA DISTRICTS**

JULY 25 – 10th AUGUST 2009

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INTRODUCTION

The implementation of the Global Fund Grant R7 has been in earnest for the past two years in a bid to reduce the mortality and morbidity trend in Sierra Leone. Tremendous efforts have been made by different stakeholders and communities to reduce morbidity and mortality. The use of free anti malarial commodities, ITNs, ACTs, RDTs through the HMM strategy were used as a strategy to achieve the above. Much have been achieved in terms of procuring and prepositioning of these commodities to the intended beneficiaries. Training of trainer's trainings and cascade trainings have been done on case management of malaria, use of SP for IPT and HMM strategy. IEC/BCC strategy has also been used to heightened sensitization for the full utilization of these commodities. Training was done on the revised data collection tools which have been printed and distributed to most PHUs countrywide. The task is thus enormous and challenging but would be achieved by concerted efforts of partners and communities.

OBJECTIVES OF THE SUPERVISION

The objectives of the supervision was to

- audit the data received from PHUs to district /central level
- To assess the level of utilisation of antimalarial commodities ;ITNs, ACTs, SP for IPT and RDT supplied to district
- To monitor the stock level of antimalarial consumables at district and PHU levels
- To identify the possible strengths, opportunities, weaknesses and threats in relation to the implementation of malaria activities

METHODOLOGY

A structured supervisory protocol was used as a guide to interview respondents mostly PHU staff on the data collection, analysis and reporting. Record review and on the job training was also done so as to synchronize the data from PHU to district / central level.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS ON THE SUPERVISION

A total of 112 PHUs were visited in all the five district supervised

STRENGTHS

- 90% of all PHU staff have been trained on case management of malaria.
- HMM implementation is currently being implemented in all the districts
- Availability of data reporting tools in most PHUs visited
- Data analyzed displayed on walls in some PHUs visited

OPPORTUNITIES

- District monthly PHU in charges meeting will enhance timely reporting from PHUs to district.
- Presence of other NGOs implementing malaria prevention and control activities in the districts
- Presence of district councils under the local Government structure.
- Availability of community radios in all the districts will help in heightened sensitization.

WEAKNESSES

- Limited feedback by DHMT to PHU staff on the outcome of district supervision especially Koinadugu district
- NGO collaboration very weak in some districts (Tonkolili and Koinadugu districts)
- Inconsistency in data reporting in Tonkolili and Koinadugu districts in some PHUs visited)
- Some PHU staff have not train CBPs for HMM implementation in some PHUs especially Bombali district
- District malaria Focal Persons in Koinadugu and Kambia are not mobile and this constraint hinders routine supervision.

THREATS

- Most PHUs in all district supervised will be experiencing ACTs/ITNs stock out especially adolescent and adult doses during the next quarter.

ACTIONS TAKEN

- On the job training of staff posted to newly established PHUs on data collection and analysis.
- Provide feedback to DHMTs/NMCP on the outcome of the supervisory visits in each district supervised.
- Develop a comprehensive supervisory protocol and reporting format with DHMT

RECOMMENDATIONS

- NMCP and partners should ensure the training of CBPs for HMM implementation especially in Bombali district.
- NMCP/PR should ensure timely provision of ACTs/ITNs to avoid stock outs.
- NMCP/PR should ensure the provision of mobility (motor bikes) to enhance district supervision to PHUs
- HMIS should implement the integrated data collection tools to ease the burden of health workers having to fill a lot of forms which is usually tired-some and confusing.
